## Professional Track

The King Graduate School offers a *Professional Track (PT)* for students enrolled in MBA, MPH, MPA, and MS programs who need professional development or work experience to supplement their program of study.

Students may be required to enroll in this track at the discretion of the admissions committee and/or Dean of the King Graduate School. Enrollment is based on a review of the student's academic and professional experience. Students may pursue this track and a concentration of their choice.

Students on the Professional Track are required to enroll in and complete either a Graduate Professional Development course or a Graduate Professional Experience course during their course of study. Once enrolled on the Professional Track, credits are required in addition to core courses and elective/concentration courses in order to graduate. Each internship opportunity must be approved in advance by a Dean of King Graduate School as an appropriate match for the student's academic program.

A student may petition to a Dean of King Graduate to be waived from the professional experience track.

## Graduate Professional Experience

The courses in this series provide students with an opportunity to combine academic study with valuable industry experience in their desired career track. Students work in an approved industry setting under the mentorship of a faculty member. Students apply theory to practice, gain managerial experience, enhance their resumes, clarify career goals, and make contact with potential employers. ## Professional Development Internship Preparation

The courses in this series allow students to build their professional skill set and their confidence as they prepare for success in their chosen field.

In addition to developing and enhancing their soft skills, students have the opportunity to increase their functional knowledge in specific areas to ensure they are prepared to tackle the challenges of today's increasingly competitive and constantly changing professional world. Graduate Internship Preparation one-credit courses include:

Foundation Courses may be required. These courses serve two primary purposes:

1. For students to master relevant knowledge and skills not included in their undergraduate studies.
2. To provide graduate school students the opportunity to refresh their knowledge of fundamental concepts and/or sharpen specific skills as needed throughout their degree programs.
